
Role of Coloured Surfacing: (1) To HIGHLIGHT

Agreed Use of Colour: GREEN

Special Veh Lanes and related facilities

- Cycleways
- Bus/HOV Lanes



- Cycling-related facilities (ASBs/ASLs/Hook-turn/sharrows)
- Transition to cycle facility to/from shoulder














Agreed Use of Colour: RED

Warning of hazard/conflict

- Speed reduction / school zones
- Either side of zebra crossings
- Pathway conflicts with pedestrians











Agreed Use of Colour: OTHER

- Blue = mobility parking
- White / yellow = various regulatory road markings
- All others can be used for placemaking





Conclusions

- To date, use of colour has been inconsistent in NZ
 - Not helped by lack of clear guidance
- Some attempts now to standardise its use going forward
 - —Although many things already out "in the wild"
- Important to appreciate the different roles of colour
 - -Highlight, Direct, Slow, Prioritise, Placemaking
- Some guidance on agreed policies to be prepared
